2019-20 LWVIC Program

Voter Services will publish voters' guides, coordinate nonpartisan voter registration events, hold candidate nights and legislative interviews, provide membership updates on legislation related to voting and elections, and provide education on redistricting.

Environmental Issues Committee will continue to explore resources relating to energy, economics, ethics, and public health. They will continue to partner with the County and other organizations to do outreach and education, with the goal of implementing recommendations to develop local jobs using sustainable energy sources. The committee will learn more about plastics, their health and environmental impact, strategies for dealing with plastic disposal, and environmentally safer alternatives to plastic through public education programs and materials. The group continues to benefit from collaboration with the Straight Scoop on Shale project, a Pittsburgh-based League initiative which monitors new legislation and research on the effects of drilling unconventional natural gas, with special emphasis on health effects.

Child Advocacy Committee on Education will monitor emerging issues, activities, and policies related to the welfare of children in Indiana County. This committee will advocate for public policy based on established positions and will promote annual events designed to educate and improve the quality of life for children.

Civic Participation Committee will continue working through education and advocacy to increase diversity in elected and appointed officials, raise awareness of the duties of elected officials to those considering public service, and encourage attendance at public meetings to ensure that government agencies are fulfilling their responsibility to be transparent and accountable to the citizenry

SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON PRIMARY DAY

Mark your calendars! Tuesday, May 21, is election day in Pennsylvania, and it's a little bit different this year; it's both a primary and a special election, and every registered voter is eligible to vote in the special election.

If you are registered with one of the major parties, you will be choosing your party's nominees to run in the general election in November, as usual during the primary. If you are registered as an independent, with another party, or with one of the major parties, you will be voting in the special election and casting your vote for District 41's new state senator who will fill this seat until November 2020.

Because PA Senator Don White resigned in February, this special election was set and will be held the same day as the primary, so even if you don't belong to one of the major parties but you are a registered voter, please show up at the polls on Tuesday, May 21. Exercise your democratic right to choose who represents you in Harrisburg.
