100th Birthday Celebration of League of Women Voters

Please join us at 12:00 noon on February 15 to celebrate the 100th Birthday of the League of Women Voters (LWV). The LWV was formed six months before the ratification of the Nineteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution with the goal of preparing newly enfranchised women to exercise their right to vote as informed and educated citizens. The LWV continues the mission of encouraging informed participation in government, increasing the understanding of major public policy issues, and influencing public policy through education and advocacy.

The highlight of our 100th Birthday Celebration will be a presentation about the role of local Indiana County women in the women's suffrage movement titled, "The 19th Century, Suffrage, and Indiana County Women." Katie Gaudreau, Historian and board member of the Historical and Genealogical Society of Indiana County, will give a living history presentation depicting how the women of Indiana County were involved in fighting for equal rights during the 19th century. From 1850 to 1900, women living in Indiana County used their voices and influence to fight for the right to vote. Although these women fought for their civil rights long before 1920, the year the Nineteenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was ratified, the marches and protests that occurred in the later years of 1900 to 1920 often overshadowed the earlier efforts of our local Indiana County women.

PLANNING MEETING - WOMEN'S HISTORY COALITION



Environmental Issues Committee


This committee studies and educates the public about environmental sustainability, the effects of Marcellus Shale drilling, and the impact of plastics on the environment, among other issues.

Shale and Public Health Conference

Environmental Issues Committee members attended the Seventh Annual Shale and Public Health Conference hosted by the LWV of Pennsylvania at the University of Pittsburgh on November 19, 2019. Displayed at the conference was the LWVPA publication, "Shale Extraction and Public Health: A Resource Guide" which was written and edited by Vera Bonnet, Chair of our LWVIC Environmental Issues Committee. The Bench Project: Boy Scout recycling project

The members of our League's Environmental Issues Committee supported the efforts of Silas Schiera to collect and recycle plastic. Silas Schiera is a Life Scout with Boy Scout Troop 1011. He developed the recycling project to earn his Eagle Scout Award, the highest attainable rank in the Boy Scouts of America.





Although Silas Schiera completed his "Bench Project", he is working with the Horace Mann Elementary School PTA, the Evergreen Conservancy, and the League of Women Voters of Indiana County to continue the collection and recycling of plastics to obtain more plastic benches. Documentary Film: "Bag It: Is your life too plastic?"

The Environmental Issues Committee hosted the public viewing of the documentary film, "Bag It: Is your life too plastic?" on November 23, 2019 at the Philadelphia Street Playhouse. Community members who shared their research, insights, and projects included IUP students and professors and Boy Scout Silas Schiera.



Collection Site for Plastics

A plastic collection site is located inside the entrance of the Indiana Borough Municipal Building, 80 North 8th Street, Indiana. The plastic bags must be clean and dry. The types of plastic bags that may be recycled include the following: grocery bags, bread bags, water case and soft drink case overwraps, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, wood pellet bags, Ziploc and other re-closable bags, produce bags, bubble wrap, salt bags, and cereal bags. Tour of Indiana Recycling Center

A tour of the Indiana County Recycling Center was held on January 11, 2020. The tour included a discussion about the overall recycling efforts in Indiana County as well as information about the types of materials that the recycling center processes. The recycling center processes items provided through their 24-hour drop off program (including glass, cardboard, office paper, magazines, and yard waste) and materials picked up through the curbside recycling program. Child Advocacy Committee on Education



The Child Advocacy Committee on Education (CACE) advocates for children's well-being, reflected in issues such as taxation and school funding, school safety, and public health. The committee presents family-oriented, public education events.

The focus this year for the CACE has been our children's safety. The committee researched how safety issues are being addressed in the schools as well as outside of schools. In brief, the topics included the effect of the legislation, PA Act 44 of 2018 including the Safe2Say Program, how to address mental health and wellness holistically, the impact of gun violence within and beyond the school setting, and how citizens may advocate to improve the safety of our children.

Committee members met with the Superintendents of Schools and the administrative teams of three school districts, Apollo-Ridge, Penns-Manor, and Indiana Area. At these informative and welcoming meetings, the following was discussed: 1. Implementation of Pennsylvania Act 44 of 2018: School Safety and Security; 2. Students' academic, social, and

emotional needs; and 3. Additional financial support necessary to address students' mental health issues.

Following the meetings with local school district administrators, the committee members led a public presentation on November 19, 2019 titled, "Our Children's Safety, Guns and Mental Health: Research and Practice."

Voter Services Committee

League volunteers registered voters at five events during the fall 2019 including the following: 1. Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP) Community Involvement Fair; 2. Northern Appalachian Folk Festival; 3. Indiana County Farmers Market; 4. Indiana Free Library and local coffee cafes in coordination with National Voter Registration Day; and 5. United States Citizenship Naturalization Ceremony hosted by IUP.

Legislative Interviews

Members of the League of Women Voters of Indiana County (LWVIC) are invited to participate in interviews with our Indiana County legislators during the month of February 2020. Prior to the scheduled meetings, we furnish the interview questions to our legislators. The interviews are an important part of the League's work. The LWVIC shares what we learn through the interviews with the LWVPA. The interviews afford us the opportunity to educate our legislators about issues, identify legislation we intend to support or oppose, and they assist us in building and maintaining relationships with our local legislators.
