# The League of Women Voters is the nation's most effective grassroots organization.

Established in 1920 after women were enfranchised, the League is now one of the nation's most respected community-based organizations. Membership has been open to men since the 1970s. Keeping the original name honors the women who struggled to win the right to vote. Our volunteers work to strengthen our democracy and our communities by:

- ★ Empowering millions of voters to exercise their right to vote by holding voter registration drives, sponsoring candidate forums, and reminding the public about their rights on Election Day.
- ★ Protecting the right to vote and ensuring that every vote is counted by fighting for and implementing voting systems that are free, fair, and accessible.
- \* Advocating for positive change at the local, state, and national levels on issues such as education, government accountability, and money in politics.
- ★ Fostering civil dialogue about issues important to the community such as government spending, climate change, immigration, and civil liberties.

League members enjoy opportunities to learn, lead, and engage with other citizens to influence public policies of local and national importance.

## Here in Indiana County, League members work to benefit our communities.

League committees study issues, provide fact-based information to the public, and suggest ways to advocate for good government solutions.

- ★ Child Advocacy Committee on Education advocates for equitable public school funding, school safety, and children's well-being. It promotes civic and voter education for young people.
- ★ Communications Committee works with other committees to provide voter information through print and digital media, social media, and radio.
- ★ Environmental Issues Committee is focused on environmental sustainability, climate change, the effects of Marcellus Shale drilling, and the impact of plastics on the environment, among other issues.
- ★ Equity Committee works for voting rights for all eligible citizens of Pennsylvania and for accessibility of our League programs.
- ★ Public Policy Committee monitors legislation involving voting access and election reform, gerrymandering's negative effects and a fair redistricting process, reproductive health issues, and gun violence.
- ★ Voter Services Committee registers voters, supports the online voter guide www.Vote411.org, sponsors public candidate forums, and encourages voters to make their voices heard.
